The EAPC Algorithm for Evaluating Episodic (Breakthrough) Cancer Pain

Overview: The Working Group of the European Association for Palliative Care (EAPC) used an algorithm to help identify the different types of breakthrough pain that can occur in a patient with terminal cancer. The type and intensity of pain being experienced can help direct palliative interventions.

Steps in episodic (breakthrough) pain evaluation:

- (1) Is there significant baseline pain indicating inadequate pain management?
 - If so: Use the WHO pain ladder of increasing analgesic pain medication to provide adequate pain management then reassess.
- (2) Are there factors that can alleviate or reduce pain?
 - If so educate and train the patient in ways to minimize pain.
